Hello Friends;

I wanted to share the work that you have helped make possible. Many of you are saying "what? , I didn't do anything..." Let me explain that; you certainly have done something because most all of you influenced this project in one way or the other without knowing it.

The mission of Serving Christ Ministries (SCM) is providing spiritual and physical nourishment to suffering children, demonstrating God's love for them and improving their quality of life.

Some of you have asked about this, and others of you are part of the inspiration that caused all this, and I am very grateful for that. The truth is, that after all the filing (and thrashing with the IRS) of the IRS 501c3 paperwork here in the USA (which started in the fall of 2011) to get this going - one of the annual filings is an Annual Report. And I figured if I had to do an annual report, then I'd have to have someone to

send it to - so there you have it.

So far, thanks to your encouragement, initial efforts of SCM have fed over 1500 breakfasts to school children who would have had none otherwise.

Our initial efforts have centered in Belize, with an exploratory project in West Africa in Ghana. Serving Christ Ministries is committed to helping children all over the world, while strengthening the local communities and churches. Both by sharing, and demonstrating the Gospel of Jesus Christ, intentionally partnering with local vendors, organizations, churches and schools to meet the local community needs as well as the needs of the children.

During incorporation, I was pretty frustrated with all the government paperwork here; then, the right thing to do in Central America was establish another company there. Yes, we have a "Branch-office" (separate corporation) in San Ignacio,

Empowerment and Partnering:

SCM builds local capacity by employing individuals and purchasing resources locally, in country in the communities where we serve. As an example in Belize, currently all the eggs, beans, bread, and fruit are locally grown and we are in negotiations with a local dairy for milk. We mix milk currently as it was the most readily available in powder form and the most cost effective. The goal is for all products to be locally grown..

Our location is only two blocks from the local farmers markets and daily we buy fresh fruit etc.

SCHOOLS INVOLVED : Initial impacts

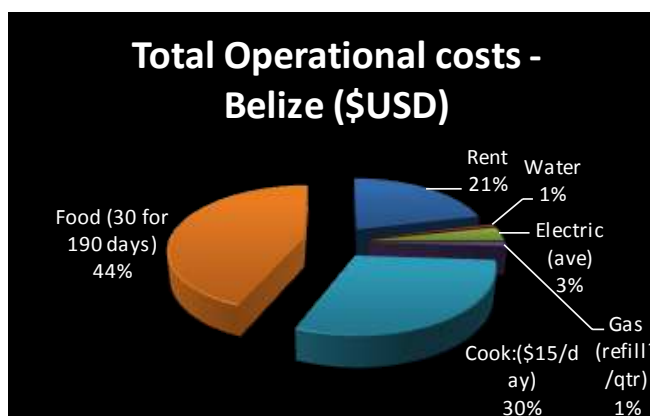
- ⇒ St. Andrews School, **Meals to date = 1600**

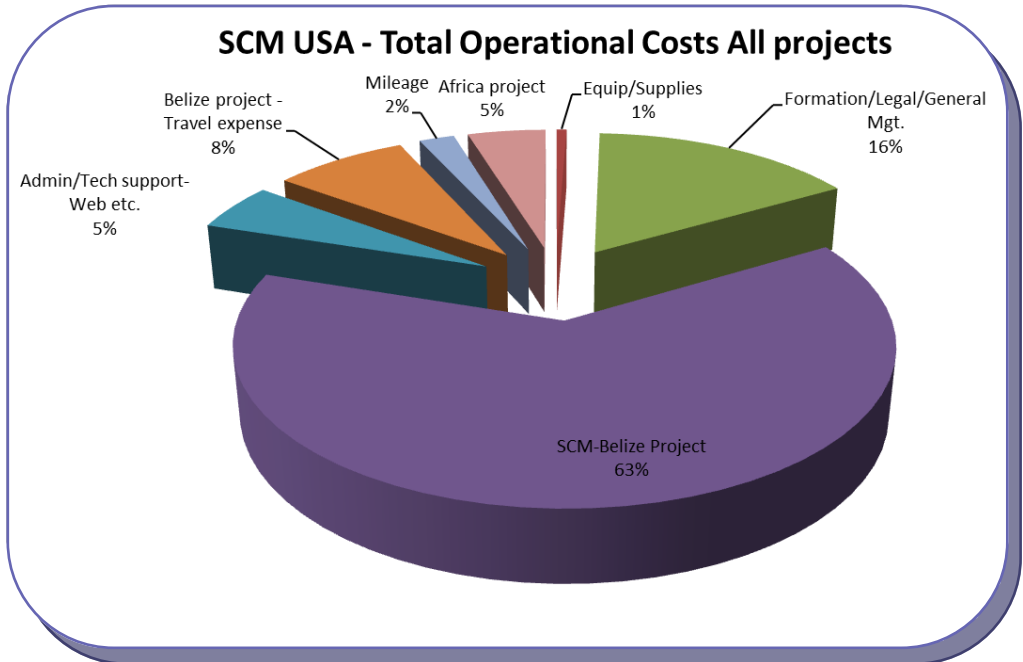
