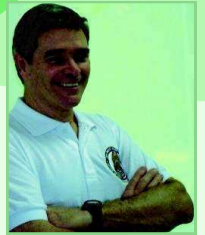

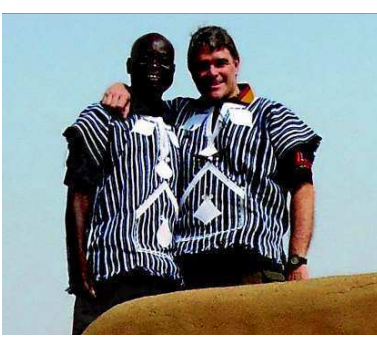

1 October 2013: Emperor Academy opens

Emperor Academy opened in October with 9 boys and 4 girls. It has already grown as of this writing to 32 students, 20 boys and 12 girls. Government inspectors visited on 17 November, resulting in a certificate of recognition several weeks later. A re-inspection for progress improvement will be done in 6 months. Founding core beliefs are God, culture, discipline, and integrity. Highlights of the current school operations & goals: Currently no child can afford to pay fees. Akunzule, SCM, and locals are supporting the operation

with donations. The current location is being improved with a new roof, concrete floors & school supplies from SCM. Nearby land has been acquired from the tribal chief to build a new permanent school and SCM will provide for the land clearing, road improvements and architectural drawings prior to construction planned for spring / summer of 2014 depending on funds. Highlights of current school operations / goals;

- ◆ 65% are orphans
- ◆ Students receive two meals / day: Breakfast + Lunch
- ◆ English w/French as second language
- ◆ Staff is 3 teachers, cook, headmistress
- ◆ Related projects designed to help parents with employment

• 1 ₵ Ghana Cedi (GHS) = \$0.431 (USD)
 • Admission = 25 GHS / year (\$10.78)/child
 • Tuition (3) 60 day terms @ 120 GHS / term (\$51.60/day)
 • Feeding 1.5 GHS/child/day (\$0.65/day)
 • **For \$300/year (about 80 cents a day) you can feed and educate a child for an entire school year.**

“Akunz” Anthony Akunzule was raised in Yua village on the border with Burkina Faso. Educated locally he set out to better himself, his people and his country. He studied in Russia and spent a year learning Russian in order to take school there and graduate; advanced degrees were earned at Cornell University in NY. He had opportunity to stay in the US and work for the university & others but his desire for Ghana was stronger. He has dedicated his life to helping others in all walks of life. He and wife Mary make sure their home is a home to many of the children from his village and others that have come to Accra, Ghana to better educate themselves knowing he will take them in. NONE of the operations in Ghana would have gotten off the ground without the efforts of Akunzule. I am blessed to know him and have him be a part of this organization. One of the highlights of my life is when he introduces me as his brother.

Asutsuare Women Development Society



On 15 December, Serving Christ Ministries and its partner organization, the Ghana Poultry Network (GAPNET) delivered 50 layer birds to the Asutsuare Women Development Society. A contract was signed by the parties and Regina Bokor received the birds. The contract lays out the agreement to care for the birds, buy necessary veterinary drugs, feed etc. and sell the eggs to everyone at a good price.



The goal of the Women Development Society is for Regina to pay for the cost of the birds (1000¢ GHS) at the end of the laying period so that another woman will also benefit. Thus the amount paid will be used to buy some birds for another member. The society numbers 50 women now.

The trip to Ghana yielded another probable partner. Pastor David Kwadwo Ofosehene is ministering to people with disabilities and physical chal-

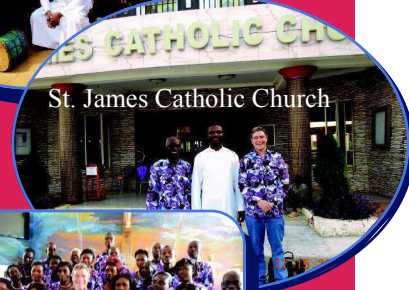

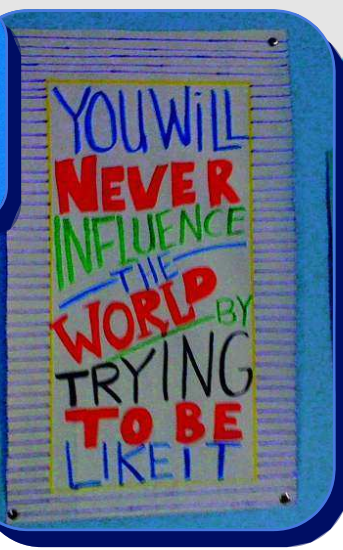
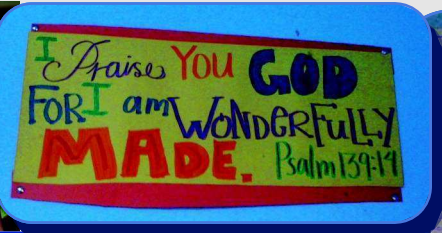
